Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks directions against respondents No.1 & 2 to file additional challan in the Court in FIR No.259 dated 05.10.2012 (Annexure P-1) according to the investigation report of Special Investigation Team dated 13.02.2014 (Annexure P-2).

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, reply was filed.

Learned Senior Counsel for respondents No.3 to 5 as well as learned counsel for the State submits that since a fresh Special Investigation Team has been constituted by the competent authority to enquire into the

matter afresh, present petition does not survive and the same may be disposed of as such, granting liberty to the parties to pursue their remedies, in accordance with law, after receipt of report of the newly constituted SIT.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that let the present petition be disposed of in view of the statement made by learned counsel for the respondents.

In view of the above, present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous. However, it is made clear that parties would be at liberty to pursue their remedies, in accordance with law, after receipt of the report submitted by the newly constituted SIT.

Disposed of, accordingly.
