AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case F.I.R. No.124 dated 08.08.2014 registered under Sections 323, 506, 354, 34 IPC and Sections 25, 54, 59 of the Arms Act at Police Station Mataur, S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali.

On 29.09.2014 the following order was passed:-

“Counsel for the petitioner states that apart from the merits of the case, the matter has been compromised between the parties. The petitioner has vacated the premises of the complainant and has also withdrawn the civil suit in which he had obtained stay order.

Counsel for the respondent, on instructions from ASI Lakhwinder Kaur, states that the police has no knowledge of the compromise and seeks a short adjournment to verify the same.

Adjourned to 3.11.2014.”

Today the learned Additional Advocate General on instructions from ASI Lakhwinder Singh states that the petitioner has vacated the premises of the complainant.

Apart therefrom the learned counsel for the petitioner states that the allegations under the Arms Act were not made against the petitioner.

In view of the facts and circumstances of the case, without going into the merits of the case, I deem it appropriate to grant the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Resultantly, the petition is allowed.

In the event of arrest of the petitioner, he shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
