INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.84 dated 02.06.2015, registered at Police Station Morinda District Rupnagar, under Sections 498-A, 354, 354-D IPC (now after inquiry, only offence under Section 498-A IPC is against the petitioner).

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition. Learned counsel for complainant has also appeared.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for complainant and have gone through the record.

At the time of arguments, learned counsel for the petitioner contended that the parties have already effected the compromise and even a petition for quashing of the said FIR on the basis of compromise has already been filed before this Court in which notice

of motion has been issued. The petitioner has already joined the investigation. He is not required for custodial interrogation. Nothing is to be recovered from him. No useful purpose will be served by sending the petitioner to custody.

Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and the facts that the parties have already effected the compromise and the petition for quashing of the said FIR on the basis of compromise has already been filed before this Court and it is mainly a matrimonial dispute, and without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merit of the case, the present petition is accepted and the order dated 03.09.2015, passed by this Court, granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.
