**FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)**

Report dated 21.10.2015 of learned Addl. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Fatehgarh Sahib has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Sukhdev Singh, injured Karnail Singh and Ranjit Singh as well as the accused persons namely Mukand Singh, Talwinder Singh, Karamjit Singh, Bhupinder Singh, Rajinder Singh, Amandip Singh, Pritam Singh, Bant Singh, Darbara Singh, Davinder Singh, Bachittar Singh, Charanjit Singh alias Charni and Kiranjit Singh, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the

compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties belong to the same very village and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of heinous nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.82 dated 30.05.2014 registered at Police Station Sirhind, District Fatehgarh Sahib under Sections 341/325/323/506/201/148/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners, except petitioner Jagdip Singh son of Harmit Singh, are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms qua the petitioners, except Jagdip Singh son of Harmit Singh qua whom the petition stands dismissed.
