Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners namely Kuldeep Kaur (mother-in-law) and Nitu Singh (sister-in-law) of the complainant, in FIR No.0243 dated 12.8.2015, under Sections 498-A, 406, 376 and 506 IPC, registered at Police Station Mahesh Nagar, District Ambala.

This Court vide order dated 7.9.2015, while issuing notice of motion, had granted interim bail to the petitioners subject to joining the investigation as and when directed by the Investigating

Agency/Investigating Officer and to abide by the terms and conditions laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that pursuant to the order dated 7.9.2015, the petitioners had joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, who is assisted by Inspector Amarjit Kaur, has stated that in terms of the above order the petitioners have joined investigation and their custodial interrogation is not required.

Learned counsel for the complainant submits that the allegations against the petitioners are serious in nature and they should not be given the concession of bail particularly when the husband is living abroad and another FIR has been registered against the petitioners.

In view of the above, the present petition is allowed and interim directions issued by this Court vide order dated 7.9.2015 are made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
