Prayer in the present petition is for grant of anticipatory bail on behalf of the petitioner/father-in-law of the complainant-wife, namely, Sonia Bhandari, in case FIR No. 334 dated 07.08.2015 for offences punishable under Sections 498-A, 406, 506, 354 and 377 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sector -31, Faridabad (**Annexure P-1**).

During the proceedings before this Court, the parties have arrived at a comprehensive compromise and the operative portion of the settlement as noticed in the previous order dated 29.09.2015 is as under:-

“ A comprehensive settlement has been arrived at, whereby a sum of Rs.5 lacs shall be paid by the husband to the complainant-wife towards full and final settlement of all her claims arising out of the marriage between the parties. The parties would withdraw all cases filed against each other. The family of the husband would make all efforts to locate

and return documents relating to education qualification, passport etc., to the complainant-wife. The parties would also file a petition qua divorce by mutual consent. ”

At the time of hearing, learned counsel for the parties state that the parties have drafted a final compromise deed and therefore, the complainant has no objection, if the anticipatory bail granted to the petitioner is confirmed.

The complainant admits that she has received a draft for a sum of Rs. 2 lacs in terms of the compromise, entered today. A photocopy of the said draft has been retained for the purpose of record.

In view of the above, the interim order dated 29.09.2015, passed by this Court, is made absolute.

The Investigating Officer, namely, SI Mukh Ram Singh, who is present in Court, fully understands the implication of the compromise and assures the Court not to take any further action against any of the parties on the basis of the aforesaid FIR.
