1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?
2. To be referred to the Reporters or not?

AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

At the very outset, learned counsel states that in the memo of parties as well as in the representation (Annexure P-5) the name of Superintendent of Police, Rohtak has inadvertently been mentioned as Sr. Superintendent of Police, Rohtak.

At the oral request of the learned counsel, the registry is directed to make necessary corrections in the aforesaid places.

Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 of the Cr.P.C. is for issuance of a direction to the official respondents to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and not to harass them at the instance of respondent Nos.4 & 5.

The petitioners have got married against the wishes of their

parents. They are stated to be major. In support of her proof of age petitioner No.1 has placed on record a copy of Affidavit (Annexure P-1) wherein her date of birth is mentioned as 24.11.1990 whereas petitioner No.2 has placed on record a copy of Secondary Examination Certificate (Annexure P-2) depicting his date of birth as 31.03.1993. They have also moved a representation before the Superintendent of Police, Rohtak (Annexure P-5) for protection of their life and liberty.

Without adverting to the merits of the controversy, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2, the Superintendent of Police, Rohtak to take appropriate action on the said representation (Annexure P-5).

Since the main case has been decided, the pending Criminal Misc. Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
