FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

These are three petitions under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in FIR No.51 dated 17.05.2015 under Sections 307,452,382,324,323,427,148,149 IPC and Sections 25(1) 27,54,59 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Sardulgarh, District Mansa.

The allegations against the petitioners Modan Singh, Chamkaur Singh, Baldev Singh son of Mehar Singh, Malkeet Singh son of Hamir Singh, Naib and Gurpreet Singh are that on 17.5.2015 all of them armed with various weapons had attacked the complainant party. The contentions of the learned counsel for the petitioners that Malkit Singh, Modan Singh and Baldev Singh are not attributed any injury and that the injury regarding which the offence under Section 307 IPC has been slapped is in respect of firearm which has hit the door of the house and the remaining injuries are on the non-vital parts of the body and that the petitioners are in custody since last about four months are conceded to at bar by the learned State counsel.

In view thereof and keeping in view that trial is not likely to be concluded in near future and that no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioners behind the bars, without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petitions for grant of regular bail are allowed. Petitioners be admitted to bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
