Counsel for the petitioner has filed her affidavit stating that accused Ramanpreet Kaur, her sister, and her brother-in-law Harmeet Singh, who were earlier holding Indian passports, are now holding Australian passports. It is deposed by her that all their passports were genuine.

It is not understandable as to how the petitioner is in a position to depose about the genuineness of passports of her sister Ramanpreet Kaur and her sister's husband – Harmeet Singh, who are also co-accused. The value of this document is nil.

It is also submitted by the State counsel that the petitioner and the other accused are not cooperating in the investigation.

All other accused besides the petitioner and her husband Ranjit Singh are living in Australia and the petitioner is not cooperating, as stated, for providing address of certain persons and other information required by

the police.

Rather the petitioner is trying to misguide by filing the affidavit mentioned above assuming herself to be the authority to depose about the genuineness of the passports of co-accused, i.e. her sister and brother-in-law Ramanpreet Kaur and Harmeet Singh respectively.

In view of the above, no ground for anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
