Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.203 dated 17.8.2015 under Sections 223, 224 and 225 IPC registered at Police Station Division No.5, Civil Line Ludhiana, District Ludhiana.

This Court vide order dated September 10, 2015 has granted interim bail to the petitioners subject to their joining investigation and complying the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that pursuant to order dated September 10, 2015, the petitioners have joined the investigation

and no recovery is to be effected from them.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from HC Satpal Singh, does not dispute the aforesaid fact and submits that though the petitioners have joined the investigation, but Mandeep Singh @ Netar Pal Singh, who has run away from the custody of the police, is yet to be arrested.

In view of the fact that the petitioners have joined the investigation and no recovery is to be effected from them, the instant petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court to the petitioners vide order dated 10.9.2015 is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
