The petitioner seeks grant of regular bail in case FIR No.52, dated 13.5.2015, registered under Section 306 of the IPC, at Police Station Nihal Singh Wala, District Moga.

Allegations are that the petitioner was having an affair with the sister-in-law (Nanad) of the deceased and they both used to talk on the telephone of the deceased. As per the allegations in the FIR, when the deceased told her husband about this, he started suspecting her (as well as harassing her for dowry) and these facts compelled her to commit suicide.

Counsel for the petitioner has argued that the petitioner has now been in custody since 21.6.2015 and he has nothing to do whatsoever

with the suicide. Neither he had any affair with the sister-in-law of the deceased nor had he any dealings with the deceased.

Learned Addl. A.G Punjab has, however, argued that the petitioner became the cause of the suicide by the deceased.

Be that as it may, without commenting upon the merits of the case, and keeping in view the period of custody already suffered by the petitioner, I deem it appropriate to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.

Petition stands disposed of.
