Prayer in this petition is for deletion of condition for interim
release of passport as incorporated in the order dated 6.8.2015 passed by
learned Additional Sessions Judge, Gurgaon.

In pursuance to the order dated 29.10.2015, SHO concerned is present in the Court.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has fairly submitted that let the passport of the petitioner be released to him, to enable him to carry his business in Bangkok. He further submits that during the pendency of the case, the petitioner shall not leave the country except with prior permission of the trial Court, and shall appear before the trial Court regularly unless he is granted exemption from personal appearance by the Court. He further submits that the petitioner shall neither delay nor prejudice the trial in any manner.

Learned counsel for respondent No.2-complainant submits that the complainant shall have no objection in case the petitioner in order to go abroad or leave the country approaches the trial Court for permission to leave the country. The petitioner may retain the passport, but he will leave the country only after permission of the Court.

I have considered the respective contentions of the parties.

Taking into consideration the respective stand of the parties, the present petition is disposed of with a direction that the petitioner shall not leave the country unless a specific permission is granted by the trial Court. So far as the release of passport is concerned, the trial Court shall release the passport enabling him to visit Bangkok to carry on his business. However, it is made clear that while releasing the passport, the trial Court may impose

any reasonable condition as it may deem fit in the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case including heavy security.

Disposed of.
