RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Petitioners seek pre-arrest bail in complaint case No.117 dated 12.03.2012 under Sections 302, 452, 34 IPC at Police Station Kanina, District Mohindergarh.

Notice of motion was issued and interim protection was granted.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in compliance of the order passed by this Court, petitioners have appeared before the learned trial Court and their bail bonds have been accepted. This fact has also been verified by learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Satpal, Police Station Kanina, Mohindergarh.

However, learned counsel for respondent No.2-complainant opposes the present petition contending that since the allegations against the

petitioners were direct and serious, they are not entitled for the concession of anticipatory bail. He prays for dismissal of the present petition.

After hearing the learned counsel for the parties and going through the record of the case, this Court is of the considered opinion that since summoning order has already been issued against the petitioners and they have put appearance before the learned trial Court who has accepted the bail bonds of the petitioners, in compliance of the order dated 14.09.2015 passed by this Court, petitioners have been found entitled for the concession of anticipatory bail, at the hands of this Court.

In view of the above and without commenting anything further on merits at this stage, lest it should prejudice the case of either side at a later point of time, instant petition is allowed and the order dated 14.09.2015 passed by this Court, is hereby made absolute.

Disposed of, accordingly.
