Petitioner seeks cancellation of anticipatory bail granted by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Faridabad to respondent No.2 vide order dated 1.9.2015 (Annexure P-6) in FIR No.24 dated 24.1.2015 registered under Sections 420/467/468/471 IPC at Police Station NIT Faridabad.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that respondent No.2 in connivance with Chander Bhushan-husband of the petitioner has played fraud with the petitioner by withdrawing money from her account. He further submits that since respondent No.2 has taken wrong averments before the learned Additional Sessions Judge with a view to get the concession of anticipatory bail, the impugned order dated 1.9.2015 is liable to be set aside. He prays for allowing the present petition.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner at considerable length, after careful perusal of the record of the case and giving thoughtful consideration to the contentions raised, this Court is of the considered opinion that no patent illegality has been found in

the impugned order dated 1.9.2015 passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Faridabad, granting the benefit of anticipatory bail to respondent No.2. It is so said, because respondent No.2 withdrew money through a cheque issued in his favour by none-else but husband of the petitioner. The plea taken by him was that husband of the petitioner issued the cheque in his name with a view to discharge his existing liability as he took a loan from respondent No.2 at the time of marriage with the petitioner.

Be that as it may, no ground for cancellation of anticipatory bail has been made out.

Dismissed.
