Learned counsel for the petitioners at the very outset, fairly states that he does not wish to press this petition for issuance of writ in the nature of certiorari, for the time being. He further submits that he has instructions to say that the present writ petition may be disposed of in terms of order dated 01.03.2011 passed by this **Court in CWP No.3686 of 2000 titled as 'Harish Kumar and others Vs. State of Haryana and others'**. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that given an opportunity, the petitioners shall approach the competent authority putting their claim on the basis of judgment of this Court in case of Harish Kumar's (supra), within a period of four weeks, by making an application and competent authority may be directed to **decide the same within a reasonable time.**

Faced with the above, learned senior counsel for the respondents could not deny the correctness of the statement made by the learned counsel for the petitioners and rightly so, because the same is based on the above said judgment rendered by this Court in Harish Kumar's case (supra).

In view of the above, present writ petition is disposed of in terms of order dated 01.03.2011 passed by this Court in **CWP No.3686 of 2000 titled as “Harish Kumar and others Vs. State of Haryana and others”**.

It is further directed that if the petitioners approach the competent authority by moving a representation within a period of four weeks, the same shall be considered and decided by the competent authority at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law and keeping in view the judgment dated 01.03.2000 passed in Harish Kumar's case (supra) but in any case within a period of three months from date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above said directions issued and observations made, present writ petition is disposed of.
