Prayer in this application, filed under Section 482, Cr.P.C., is for grant of exemption from filing certified copies of Annexures P-1 and P-2.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and going through the contents of the application, the applicant is granted exemption from filing the certified copies of Annexures P-1 and P-2.

Criminal Miscellaneous Application stands disposed of.

CRM No.M-32381 of 2015

Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 439, Cr.P.C., is

for grant of bail to the petitioner-Mohd. Masrool Khan, who has been booked for having committed the offences punishable under Sections 120-B and 376 of Indian Penal Code, in a case arising out of FIR No.179 dated 08.04.2015, registered at Police Station Manimajra, Chandigarh.

Learned counsel contends that the petitioner is brother-in-law (Jija) of the prosecutrix; the younger brother of the petitioner alleged to have committed rape on the prosecutrix and the only role assigned to the petitioner is that he facilitated his younger brother to run away after committing the rape and forced the prosecutrix to get the abortion done of the fetus.

Learned counsel for the State opposes the grant of bail to the petitioner but fairly concedes the facts narrated by learned counsel for the petitioner to be correct.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and going through the material available on record, the present petition is accepted and the petitioner-Mohd Masrool Khan S/o Mohd. Ulfath R/o #5049/2, M.H.C., Manimajra, Chandigarh (UT), is directed to be released on bail during the pendency of the trial in the present case, subject to furnishing his bail bonds to the satisfaction of the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Chandigarh.
