RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK J. (ORAL)

Petitioner by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks directions to the official respondents to take appropriate legal action against private respondents No. 4 to 11.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned counsel for the State submits that all the complaints moved by the petitioner have been inquired into and no substance was found in any of the complaints submitted by the petitioner. In fact, petitioner has been making similar complaints earlier also and at no point of time any of the allegations levelled by the petitioner have ever been substantiated, which shows that the petitioner is habitual of making frivolous complaints. However, learned counsel for the State fairly states that in case any of the complaint moved by the petitioner is found based on well founded

allegations, appropriate action shall be taken thereon. She prays for disposal of the present petition.

Neither anyone has come present nor a request for pass over has been made on behalf of the petitioner.

In view of the above, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to the Commissioner of Police, Jalandhar-respondent No.2 that if the petitioner approaches him in future with a complaint having substance therein, he shall ensure taking appropriate action thereon, strictly in accordance with law.

With the observations made and directions issued, present petition stands disposed of.
