JASWANT SINGH, J. (Oral)

The prayer is for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.103 dated 01.07.2015, under Section 21/22/27A of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, registered with Police Station Baragudha, District Sirsa.

As per the allegations, the main co-accused Baljinder Singh was apprehended with 37 bottles, out of which 11 bottles of Rexcof Marka Cipla and 26 bottles of Relaxcof Mark Biogenic, all containing 100 ml. each of the liquid.

Upon the disclosure statement of the said Baljinder Singh, it became apparent that he had purchased the said contraband from the present petitioner/accused-Raghubir Singh.

It is contended that apart from the disclosure statement of the co-accused, there is absolutely no evidence against the petitioner. He further contends that the petitioner is in custody since 10.07.2015 and the investigations qua him are over.

Learned State Counsel, on instructions from S.I. Gopal Ram, concedes that apart from the disclosure statement of the co-accused and of the petitioner himself admitting his guilt, there is no other evidence collected by the prosecution.

Without commenting upon the merits of the case, keeping in view the facts as noticed above, this Court finds that petitioner/accused deserves the concession of regular bail and as such he is ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of CJM/Duty Magistrate, Sirsa.

Disposed of.
