1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?

AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for anticipatory bail filed in case bearing FIR No. 73 dated 16.07.2015, under Sections 452/323/148/149 IPC and Sections 25/27/54/59 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Chabhal, District Tarn Tran, later on offence under Section 325 IPC added.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that this is a case of version and cross version. Despite the fact that serious injuries under Sections 307 IPC have been inflicted on the petitioner's side, the police has made no attempt to arrest those culprits because they are influential persons who have not even bothered to file a petition for anticipatory bail whereas four persons from the petitioner's side were granted anticipatory bail. Learned Addl.AG, on instructions from ASI Baljeet Singh, has accepted that on the petitioner's side there were serious injuries under Section 307 IPC reported but no arrest has been made.

In the circumstances I do not deem it appropriate to deny the prayer of the petitioner. Let him appear before the investigating officer on 13.10.2015 between 10.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. and on any other date on which his appearance is so required by the investigating officer. On his appearance the investigating officer shall release him on anticipatory bail to his satisfaction subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
