Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeking appropriate directions.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, she finally approached the Inspector General of Police, Jalandhar Zone, Jalandhar-respondent No.2 by way of self-contained representation dated 15.9.2015 (Annexure P-3), but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide her representation, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Inspector General of Police, Jalandhar Zone, Jalandhar-respondent No.2, is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised in her representation dated 15.9.2015 (Annexure P-3) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. Respondent No.2 shall also ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioner and her family members by the private respondents or anybody else on their behalf.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present petition stands disposed of.
