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ANITA CHAUDHRY, J. (ORAL)

The instant petition is for quashing of FIR No.1012 dated 02.10.2014 registered against the petitioner and others under Sections 192, 194, 420, 467, 468 and 471 read with Section 120-B IPC at Police Station Sirsa Sadar, District Sirsa and the consequent proceedings arising out of the same, on the basis of written compromise (Annexure P-2) arrived at between the parties.

Report has been received from learned CJM, Sirsa after statements of the parties were recorded regarding the compromise. Learned CJM has reported that the compromise between the petitioner and the complainant is voluntary and without any pressure or coercion. Learned CJM has also sent copy of the statements of parties. The statements reveal that there are other accused also but

the compromise has been effected between the petitioner and the complainant only.

Reply filed by the State counsel is taken on record. Learned counsel for the State on instructions submits that respondent no.2 is the only aggrieved person in this FIR.

No useful purpose would be served to keep the FIR pending.

In view of the statements and report of the trial Court and the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, approved by Hon'ble Apex Court in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303**, the instant petition is allowed and the aforesaid FIR and all consequent proceedings conducted on the basis thereof are quashed qua the petitioner only.

Needless to say that parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise and their statements made in the Court below.
