Petitioner, by way of an instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks transfer of investigation of the case FIR No.135 dated 21.03.2014 under Section 304-A of IPC, registered at Police Station Mani Majra, Chandigarh.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto reply on behalf of respondent No.3 had been filed.

Learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 4 to 6 on instructions from Rohit Kumar, SI, Police Station Mani Majra, Chandigarh submits that an effective investigation has been conducted and after the completion of the investigation, report has been submitted to the higher authorities for their approval. He further submits that once the investigation report is approved by the higher

authorities, the same shall be presented to the learned Court of competent jurisdiction within a period of one month from today. He further submits that in this view of the matter, the present petition has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that let the present petition be disposed of in view of the statement made by learned counsel for the respondents but liberty may be granted to the petitioner to pursue his remedy in accordance with law.

In view of the above statements, instant petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous, however, with liberty as prayed for.
