Petitioner Lovepreet Singh alias Labha alias Baljit Singh has preferred this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.60 dated 07.09.2014, registered at Police Station Purana Shalla, District Gurdaspur, under Sections 307, 323, 324, 34 IPC (Section 307 IPC added later).

Learned counsel for the petitioner contended that there is delay of 2 days in registering the FIR. Learned counsel for the petitioner further contended that the petitioner is innocent and he was not present on the spot at the time of occurrence.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per police record, injury No.1 with 'dattar' on the front portion of head of complainant is attributed to petitioner which is declared dangerous to life. He is required for custodial interrogation.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; the nature and gravity of the offence and the fact that injury dangerous to life has been attributed to the petitioner, I do not find any ground to grant to benefit of anticipatory bail to him.

Accordingly, the instant petition stands dismissed.
