Petitioner seeks concession of regular bail in a case registered at the instance of Harbinder Singh alleging that the complainant wanted to hire a driver for which the co-accused of the petitioner Kuldeep Singh was contacted. Said Kuldeep Singh had taken car for washing but did not return it and absconded. The Car has already been recovered from Delhi and a case stands registered against the petitioner at Delhi also. The petitioner has been in custody since 22.12.2013. Out of 10 prosecution witnesses, no witness appears to have been examined. In above circumstances, the petitioner can be granted the concession of regular bail.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that since the petitioner is a resident of Uttar Pradesh, it will not be feasible for him to arrange surety.

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Taking into consideration, the above said circumstances, this petition is allowed. It is ordered that in case the petitioner offers, he shall be released on bail on his furnishing personal bond in the sum of Rs.2 lacs with one surety in the sum of Rs.50,000/-. In case he is not able to furnish surety, he can be granted the concession of bail on his depositing a sum of Rs.50,000/- with the Court without prejudice to his liability arising out of personal bond in the sum of Rs.2 lacs. In case of petitioner absconding, besides the amount of personal bond, the amount of surety would be liable to be forfeited to the State.
