officials of Police Station Sector-39, Chandigarh, for not discharging their legal duties.

The petitioner, who is present in person, has stated that she is residing at Kharar. However, she needs protection in Sector-40, Chandigarh, where her property is situated.

In this case, the Court, vide order dated 19.1.2015, already passed the order, directing the U.T. Chandigarh, to instruct the PCR of the area to keep a special vigil on the disputed site to see that no law and order problem is created. In addition to the said direction, further direction was issued that if the petitioner approaches the police making complaint about her life and liberty, the same shall be protected. If the petitioner makes any complaint, the police will look into the same and dispose of the same in accordance with law.

Petition is accordingly disposed of.
