The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking directions to the official respondents to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners on the basis of an apprehension voiced in the petition that they have a threat from the private respondents on account of having entered into matrimony against the wishes of their elders.

Notice of motion was issued on 14.10.2014 and liberty was granted to the petitioners to approach respondent No.2 for protection as per instructions dated 10.08.2010 issued by the Home Department, State of Punjab.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from HC Balbir Singh would submit that statements of both the petitioners have since been recorded and they have stated that they are living happily together and do not need any police protection.

Even counsel appearing for the petitioners would submit that

the marriage between the petitioners has been accepted by their families and as such, they do not apprehend any threat as of now to their life and liberty.

Accordingly, no further directions are required to be passed in the instant petition and the same is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
