REKHA MITTAL, J.(ORAL)

No one is present on behalf of the petitioner. The situation was no different on the last date of hearing.

The present petition for grant of bail has been filed by Inderjit Singh, accused of keeping in possession 2 kg. heroin without any permit or licence.

Counsel for the State has submitted that recovery effected from the petitioner falls within the preview of commercial quantity and the trial is progressing well. It is further argued that out of ten witnesses cited by the prosecution, eight have already been examined and every effort would be made to conclude prosecution evidence expeditiously.

There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner to controvert the submissions made by counsel for the State.

Keeping in view the provisions of Section 37 of the Narcotic

Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 coupled with the factum that the prosecution evidence is likely to be concluded shortly, I do not think it to be a fit case wherein the petitioner deserves to be released on bail.

Dismissed.
