FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 18.11.2015 of learned Addl. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barnala has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Jagraj Singh, eye-witness Bikramjit Singh @ Vicky and the accused persons namely Sardar Ali @ Shingara, Boota Khan @ Soni, Ramjan Khan @ Kala and Gursewak Singh, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise Ex.C1 has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties belong to the same very area and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of heinous nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.42 dated 25.08.2009 registered at Police Station Mehal Kalan, District Barnala under Sections 452/323/447/511/427/148/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
