Petitioner seeks pre-arrest bail in FIR No.215 dated 19.06.2015 under Sections 406, 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Sector-36, Chandigarh.

Notice of motion was issued and interim protection was granted.

Learned counsel for U.T. Chandigarh, on instructions from SI Gyan Singh, Police Station-36, Chandigarh as well as learned counsel for the complainant submit that although petitioner has joined the investigation but the recovery has not been got effected.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is ready for amicable settlement on any reasonable terms and conditions.

After hearing the learned counsel for the parties, keeping in view the bright chances of amicable settlement between the parties and right of recovering the dowry articles of the complainant reserved, this being a matrimonial dispute, instant petition is allowed and the order dated 26.10.2015 passed by this Court is hereby made absolute, however, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
