The petition is under Section 438 read with Section 482 of Cr.P.C. seeking for ad-interim anticipatory/transit bail of 30 days to the petitioners in order to enable them to approach the competent Court at Jaipur to seek concession of bail with reference to FIR No. 116 dated 19.05.2014 under Sections 196, 380, 406, 420, 120-B IPC registered at Police Station Bhatta Basti, Jaipur.

It is learnt that complainant Rajeev Bajpayee is running M/s Wizard Biotech Private Limited and petitioners No.1 and 2 are Directors of M/s Scot Edil Pharmacia Limited, Chandigarh. They had entered into an agreement for supply of raw-materials from the complainant to the

petitioners. Due to some misunderstanding among them cheque transactions were collapsed. Consequently, criminal proceedings were initiated in the FIR No. 116 dated 19.05.2014 registered at Police Station Batta Basti, Jaipur is one of the case.

Without going into the merits of the case, the petitioners are entitled for interim bail for a period of 15 days from today. The same is granted in order to enable the petitioners to approach the jurisdictional Court at Jaipur for other remedies.

Accordingly, the petition is disposed of.
