Prayer is under Section 439 Cr.PC for grant of regular bail to the petitioner Sangeet @ Peetal in case FIR No.100 dated 06.03.2015 for offence punishable under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 302 of Indian Penal Code and Section 25/54/59 of Arms Act registered with Police Station Indri, District Karnal.

As per allegations in the FIR, there was a previous quarrel between the brother of the complainant-Rahul, namely, Rohit with accused Naveen, Ankit and Rana, which led to three accused to take a group of 16/17 friends to the house of Rohit on the day of Holi on 06.03.2015 at about 3.50 PM. The main accused Ankit is alleged to have put a country made pistol on the head of said Rohit and while saving him, his father Raj

Kumar was inflicted fatal knife blows by Naveen on his chest while Rana and Satish caught hold of the deceased.

The name of the petitioner has surfaced during investigation, except the disclosure statement of the main accused Ankit, stating the fact of the petitioner Sangeet @ Peetal accompanying them to the house of the deceased, there is neither any other evidence nor any role attributed.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is in custody since 24.03.2015. It is further submitted that he is a student of B.A. Final Year and is not involved in any other criminal activity. It is further stated that co-accused Anuj and Shubham who are similarly placed as the petitioner have since been granted regular bail by this Court vide order dated 16.09.2015 and 04.11.2015.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Ram Asre concedes that the investigations are over, challan has been presented and rest of the accused have since been granted bail.

Without commenting on the merits of the case, keeping in view the custody period, parity of treatment and facts of the case as noticed above, this Court finds that petitioner-accused Sangeet @ Peetal deserves the concession of regular bail and as such he is ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of learned CJM/Duty Magistrate, Karnal.

Petition stands disposed of.
