Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.42 dated 2.4.2014, under Sections 498-A, 406 and 323 read with Section 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Moga City, District Moga.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that this Court vide order dated 26.11.2014 granted interim protection to the petitioner and referred the matter to the mediation centre vide order dated 23.1.2015 directing the parties to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation

Centre on 12.2.2015. Accordingly, the parties appeared before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the report received from the Mediation and Conciliation Centre suggests that the parties have settled their dispute by way of compromise and the terms of settlement have been signed by the parties. Pursuant thereto the parties are staying together as husband and wife. Accordingly, the present petition has been rendered infructuous.

However, on instructions of HC Sukhminder Singh, learned State counsel does not dispute the compromise effected between the parties and states that the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is not required at this stage.

Dismissed as having become infructuous.
