Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks direction to the official respondents No.1 to 3 to take appropriate action and investigate FIR No.15 dated 01.02.2013 under Sections 420, 465, 468, 471, 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station City-1 Malerkotla, District Sangrur.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, reply by way of affidavit dated 04.07.2015 filed in the Court today, is taken on record and copy thereof has been supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the State submits that after conclusion of the investigation, cancellation report was prepared and the same has already

been presented to the learned Court of competent jurisdiction, rendering the present petition as infructuous.
