Petitioner remains unrepresented despite the case having been called twice since morning.

Learned counsel for U.T., Chandigarh, at the outset, submits that investigation is in progress. Allegation against the accused is that he purchased 30 tyres from the complainant but failed to make payment of about ₹6 lacs. He issued cheques in lieu of the amount due but same were dishonoured due to insufficient funds in the account. According to him, accused caused a wrongful loss to the complainant and accused is guilty of offence under Sections 420/406 IPC as there was dishonest intention on his part from the very inception of the transaction.

Under the circumstances, there is no ground to grant discretionary relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Dismissed.
