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1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?
2. To be referred to the Reporter or not?

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REKHA MITTAL, J. (Oral)

The petitioner prays for grant of regular bail under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (in short, Cr.P.C.) in FIR No. 314 dated 21.05.2014 for offence punishable under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code (in short, IPC) registered in Police Station Ballabgarh City, District Faridabad.

Counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is in custody since 08.08.2014 and no longer required for the purpose of investigation. The challan has been presented in the Court and conclusion of trial is likely to take its own time. It is further submitted that all the offences for which the petitioner has been booked are triable by the judicial Magistrate.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Balwan Singh,

P S City Balbgarh, Faridabad has not disputed factual assertions.

I have heard counsel for the parties and perused the records.

As there is no allegation against the petitioner that he is likely to flee from process of justice in case enlarged on bail and offences for which he has been booked are triable by the Judicial Magistrate, without meaning to express any opinion on the merit of the controversy, bail to petitioner Jagpal on his furnishing personal/surety bonds subject to satisfaction of the learned trial Court. However, he shall abide by the following conditions:-

- (i) he shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer; and
- (ii) he shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.
