REKHA MITTAL, J. (Oral)

The petitioners pray for grant of regular bail in FIR No. 329 dated 11.08.2014 for offence punishable under Sections 147, 148, 149, 323, 342, 307 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code (in short, 'IPC') registered in Police Station Manimajra, UT Chandigarh.

Counsel for the petitioners, at the outset would submit that the petition on behalf of Ganga Prashad-petitioner No. 4 may be dismissed as withdrawn at this stage.

Ordered accordingly.

Counsel for the petitioners would contend that the petitioners namely Prem Pal, Surinder and Ramesh are in custody for the past more than six months. The injuries attributed to the present petitioners are simple in nature and injury, constituting offence under Section 307 IPC has been attributed to said Ganga Prashad. The petitioners are ready to face trial without any default when otherwise conclusion of trial is likely to take its own time.

Counsel for the State – Union Territory, Chandigarh has not disputed factual assertions.

I have heard counsel for the parties and perused the records.

Without meaning to express any opinion on merits of the controversy, bail to petitioners namely Prem Pal, Surinder and Ramesh on their furnishing personal/surety bonds subject to satisfaction of the learned trial Court. However, they shall abide by the following conditions:-

- (i) they shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer; and
- (ii) they shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.
