The present petition has been filed for grant of the anticipatory bail by petitioner Manjit Kaur in case FIR No. 91 dated 03.04.2014, under Sections 307, 452, 324, 323, 148, 149 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga.

As per the prosecution allegations, the present petitioner and her co-accused have caused injuries to complainant Lovepreet Singh. The petitioner was alleged to be armed with Gandassi and has caused two injuries to the complainant on his left arm and left index and middle finger.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner is an unmarried girl. She has been falsely implicated in this case in-fact injuries were caused to her and her mother Jasmel Kaur. The police is not doing the fair investigation as no action has been taken

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against the complainant party for causing injuries to the petitioner and her mother. He further contended that petitioner has already joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on the instructions of ASI Charanjit Singh has stated that the petitioner has already joined the investigation, but she has not handed over the weapon of offence. Learned State counsel also admits that the injuries attributed to the present petitioner are simple in nature.

This fact has not been disputed that petitioner has already joined the investigation as per the direction of this Court and has been sufficiently interrogated. It is also not disputed that she has suffered four injuries and was medico legally examined. Her mother Jasmel Kaur has also suffered two injuries including the amputation of the ring finger of the right hand. But, no action has been taken on their version by the police. The injuries attributed to the present petitioner on the person of complainant Lovepreet Singh are on the non-vital part of the body and are simple in nature. Her custodial interrogation is not needed as she has already joined the investigation.

Thus, without expressing anything on the merits of the case, the order of interim anticipatory bail dated 09.02.2015 is hereby made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of.
