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**JASPAL SINGH, J.**

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that he does not want to proceed with the instant petition on behalf of petitioner No.2 Narinder Pal Sharma and withdraw the same.

Accordingly, petition is dismissed as withdrawn qua petitioner No.2.

The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No. 106, dated 11.08.2014, under Sections 406/498-A of the Indian Penal Code registered at Police Station Sadar, District Ropar on the basis of

compromise and affidavit of respondent No.2 (Annexure P-3).

Report of learned Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that matter has been compromised between the accused and complainant without any pressure, coercion or undue influence. Even otherwise, the matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest. Compromise is the soul of justice, which not only enhances the social amity, harmony and peace but also reduces friction and discord.

So, in view of above circumstances and in view of authorities reported as **Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another; 2012(4) RCR(Criminal) 543** and **Kulwinder Singh & others v. State of Punjab & others; 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

Consequently, the instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 106, dated 11.08.2014, under Sections 406/498-A of the Indian Penal Code registered at Police Station Sadar, District Ropar and all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua petitioners No. 1 and 3 only.
