**MAHESH GROVER, J.**

The petitioner prays for grant of regular bail in terms of Section 439 Cr.P.C in case FIR no. 110 dated 12.4.2014 registered under Sections 304, 34 IPC at Police Station, Jodhewal, District Ludhiana City.

The facts would indicate a dispute between neighbours which turned violent leading to exchange of bricks. The incident is of 25.3.2014 and the deceased died 17 days thereafter.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that he has been in custody since 13.8.2014 and the charges have since been framed. He further contends that the dispute had erupted between neighbours and there was absolutely no intention to cause any such injury of the kind which has resulted in death of the deceased. He further contends that even otherwise death took place after 17 days of the incident.

Be that as it may be and without commenting upon the merits of the case and noticing the fact of incarceration of the petitioner since

August, 2014 and the fact that charges have been framed, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in custody since trial is also likely to take some time, instant petition is accepted. It is directed that the petitioner be released on bail in terms of Section 439 Cr.P.C. Bail to the satisfaction of learned Trial Court.
