JASWANT SINGH, J. (Oral)

The prayer is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 41 dated 09.07.2015, under Sections 22/61/85 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (for short 'NDPS Act'), registered with Police Station Sadar Budhlada, District Mansa (**Annexure P-1**).

As per allegations in the FIR, the petitioner/accused was apprehended on 09.07.2015 and 300 tablets of Diatil-DD were recovered from his possession.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner/accused submits that as per the Chemical Examiner Report, the seized tablet do not contain any banned substance, which is covered under the Schedule of the NDPS Act and, therefore, no offence is made out.

Learned State Counsel, on instructions from ASI Gurpal Singh, concedes that the seized tablets do not contain any banned substance under the NDPS Act.

In view of the stand of the prosecution and without commenting on the merits of the case, this Court finds that petitioner/accused-Mohinder Ram deserves the concession of regular bail and as such he is ordered to be released immediately on bail to the satisfaction of CJM/Duty Magistrate, Mansa.
