Main case

The petitioner in the instant petition prays for grant of pre-arrest bail in case complaint case no. 37 dated 22.7.2010 filed under Sections 498-A, 304-B, 120-B IPC in the Court of learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Ajnala, District Amritsar.

The petitioner is sister in law of the deceased i.e daughter of the complainant who was married to the brother of the petitioner. The death of the deceased took place within six months of the marriage and despite the FIR all the persons were declared innocent which led to the filing of complaint.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has no role in the matrimonial affairs of her brother and the deceased and

that she has been falsely implicated.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the complainant with reference to the material on record points out to the harassment meted out to the deceased and thus prays that concession of pre-arrest bail ought not be granted to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has unequivocally stated that she is participating in the trial and has already appeared before the Trial Court.

If that be so then I am of the view that the petitioner having undertaken to participate in the trial and she being the sister in law of the deceased with a possibility of allegations being made to aggravate the offence and enlarge the array of accused, instant petition is accepted. Interim directions dated 25.11.2014 are hereby made absolute but with a direction that petitioner will submit an undertaking before the Trial Court that she will continue to associate herself with the trial.
