Both these petitions have been filed by the petitioner(s) under
Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.
195 dated 04.11.2013 under Sections 323, 307, 148, 149 IPC and

Sections 25, 30, 54 and 59 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Sadar, Samana, District Patiala, on the basis of compromise along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

2. Report of learned Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that compromise was effected between the parties without any pressure or coercion. The same is genuine one. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. Learned State counsel submits that offence under Section 307 has already been deleted, during investigation and challan has not been presented so far.

4. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in case reported as **Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another; 2012(4) RCR(Criminal) 543**, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petitions are allowed and FIR No. 195 dated 04.11.2013 under Sections 323, 307, 148, 149 IPC and Sections 25, 30, 54 and 59 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Sadar, Samana, District Patiala and all other subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom stand quashed qua the petitioner(s).
