Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeks appropriate direction to the official respondents to register FIR against respondent no.5.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, replies by way of affidavits have been filed.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Dilbagh Singh, ASI, submits that allegations levelled by the petitioner were enquired into by conducting an effective enquiry, but the allegations could not be found substantiated. Accordingly, the petitioner was advised to file his criminal complaint before the learned court of competent jurisdiction, if so desired. She further submits that in any case, no further orders are called for in the present petition and the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered

infructuous.

After hearing learned counsel for the State and going through the record of the case, instant petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous, however, liberty is granted to the petitioner to avail his other remedies, in accordance with law.
