Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of the respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeking appropriate direction.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed by the respondent authorities, he sent an appropriate representation Annexure P-4 to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran-respondent No.2 by way of registered post dated 28.10.2015, but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran-respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide his representation (Annexure P-4), within a reasonable time.
