The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.122

dated 01.11.2015 registered under Sections
148,149,186,224,225,323,324,341,342,332,353 and 506 IPC at Police
Station Jhansa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that bail had been
allowed to Shashi Bala and Daler Singh by the Additional District Judge
against whom similar allegations were levelled while bail had been denied
to the petitioner. He further contends that Sarpanch and Chowkidar of the
village had made a statement that false allegations had been levelled and
the police had not informed the Sarpanch before entering the village.

It is also stated that Raftar Singh had surrendered in the Court

on 05.11.2015.

Learned State counsel submits that the police team had gone to arrest Raftar Singh, who was wanted in a case registered under Section 376 IPC and the police party was attacked with lethal weapons and the allegations against the petitioner are that he was holding a dranti and injuries were inflicted on the police official. It was urged that bail had been allowed to Shashi Bala as she was in the advance stage of pregnancy and against the other no specific allegations were made but as against the petitioner the allegations were serious and he had caused injuries on the head with a dranti.

The allegations are serious. The petitioner had attacked the police which had come to the village to arrest Raftar Singh wanted in a case registered under Section 376 IPC. Raftar Singh managed to escape. The police was unable to arrest him because of the fact that they were attacked by the petitioner and other persons.

No case for anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
