Petitioner, by way of second petition, under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeks regular bail in case FIR No.215 dated 29.09.2013 under Section 21/61/85 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, registered at Police Station, Sadar Tarn Taran, District Tarn Taran.

After arguing the case for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he does not intend to press this petition any further, at this stage. He seeks permission of the Court to withdraw the present petition however, with a prayer that the learned trial Court may be directed to expedite the trial.

Learned counsel for the State has also fairly stated that she has got no objection in case the learned trial Court is directed to expedite the trial.

In view of the above, present petition is dismissed as not pressed, at this stage. However, keeping in view the peculiar fact

situation obtaining in the present case, learned trial Court is directed to make an endeavour to expedite the trial and to conclude the same at an early date. At the same time prosecuting agency is also directed to ensure that no delay in the trial takes place because of non-appearance of the summoned witnesses.

Disposed of, accordingly.
