Petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C., seeking regular bail in case FIR No.97 dated 07.08.2015, registered at Police Station Nangal, District Ropar, under Sections 307, 323, 341, 148 and 149 IPC.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Ms. Simsi Dhir Malhotra, DAG, Punjab has accepted notice on behalf of respondent(s)-State and contested the instant petition. Police record is also available.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per FIR, the petitioner was armed with 'kirpan' and he inflicted two simple injury with the said kirpan to complainant. The injury dangerous to life is attributed to co-accused, who caused 'gandasi blow from its sharp side on the head of the complainant. The injury dangerous to life is not attributed to the petitioner. It is contended that the main accused has already been granted bail under Section 167 (2) Cr.P.C. The petitioner is in custody since

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02.09.2015. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the disposal of the case

Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merit of the case, the present petition is accepted and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of ₹ 50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate, Ropar
