AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for anticipatory bail filed in case bearing FIR No. 266 dated 29.11.2014, under Sections 406, 420, 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Patran, Distt.Patiala.

On 12.12.2014 the following order was passed:-

“ Learned counsel has argued that the 8 legal representatives of Gurditta Mal sold their inheritance by 8 different sale deeds to 7 persons during the period of one week between 06.12.2011 to 30.12.2011 and subsequently three of them made the allegation that they have not received the sale consideration. On two occasions this application was found to be meritless and was filed but on the third occasion the present FIR has been lodged.

Notice of motion for 17.02.2015.

In the meantime let the petitioner appear before the investigating officer who shall release him on interim bail to his satisfaction subject to the conditions as envisaged under section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Today learned Addl.AG, on instructions from SI Nasib Singh, states that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is no more required for custodial interrogation.

In the circumstances the interim order dated 12.12.2014 is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of.

Since the main case has been decided, the Criminal Misc.Application, if any also stands disposed of.
