MAHESH GROVER, J.(Oral)

This is a petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C praying for quashing of FIR No.527 dated 14.10.2014 registered under Section 454 (Ist Part) of IPC at Police Station Sector 34, Chandigarh and all the consequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise.

On 23.01.2015, this Court had directed the Illaqa Magistrate to record the statement of all the affected persons and further record a finding as to whether the compromise has been effected voluntarily by the parties and a report in this regard was also called for.

That report has since been received along with copies of the statements of the affected persons which also indicates that the matter has been resolved amicably between the parties without any pressure from any quarter.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***Gold Quest International Private Ltd. vs. State of Tamil Nadu and others, 2014(4) RCR***

(Crl.) 206 has held that the disputes which are substantially matrimonial in nature, or the civil property disputes with criminal facets, if the parties have entered into settlement, and it has become clear that there are no chances of conviction, there is no illegality in quashing the proceedings under Section 482 Cr.PC read with Article 226 of the Constitution.

The Hon'ble Division Bench of this Court in **Sube Singh & anr. vs. State of Haryana & anr., 2013(4) RCR (Crl.) 102** has held that the High Court is vested with unparalleled power to quash criminal proceedings at any stage to secure the ends of justice .

Having regard to the aforesaid and the observations made by the Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh v. State of Punjab reported as 2007(3) Law Herald 2225** and of Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Vs. St. of Punjab** reported as **2012 (4) RCR (Crl.) 543**, instant petition is accepted. Consequently, FIR No.527 dated 14.10.2014 registered under Section 454 (Ist Part) of IPC at Police Station Sector 34, Chandigarh and all the consequent proceedings arising therefrom qua petitioner are hereby quashed.
