TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.

The instant petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking concession of regular bail in FIR No.41 dated 21.04.2013 under Section 22 of the NDPS Act registered at Police Station Banur, District Patiala.

Counsel for the parties have been heard.

Alleged recovery from the petitioner is 500 grams of diphenoxylate powder which concededly would be construed as commercial quantity. Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Nahar Singh would apprise the Court that the trial is at the final stage and all the prosecution witnesses have since been examined.

In view of the commercial quantity allegedly recovered from the petitioner and coupled with the fact that the trial is at the final stage, I do not find it to be a fit case to release the petitioner on regular bail.

The instant petition is dismissed accordingly.

Trial Court is otherwise directed to expedite the trial and to

conclude the same within a period of three months from the date of passing
of this order.
